To start off the month of December, the grade six class shared at chapel a presentation of the book *You are Special* by Max Lucado. The play takes place in Wemmickville where the citizens judge each other with dots and stars - dots for mistakes or qualities that are poor, and stars to celebrate successes. The story follows Punchinello, a clumsy downcast Wemmick, who is covered in dots. He meets Lucia who does not have any dots or stars and she points him to Eli the carpenter. In visiting Eli, the master carpenter, Punchinello learns that he is wonderfully made, he is well known, and he is made without mistakes. Eli also reminds the young Wemmick that if he visits Eli everyday that he will be reminded more and more how much the carpenter cares for his creation.


New JKCS Clubs:

The goal of this trip is to assist with an ongoing building project and establish a foot care clinic.

VOUCHER ~ GIFTCARDS

The Voucher Program is a gift card purchasing program in which the school can raise money at no cost to yourself. The school purchases gift cards in bulk, and in return the school earns a percentage of the face value of the gift certificates. The school keeps 40% of this revenue and then gives the remainder back to the individual family in the form of a tuition reduction. Anyone in the community can participate in this program.

If every family at John Knox uses the program to purchase their groceries, the savings can accumulate to a significant amount. Remember that your friends and family can also participate in this program, making a bigger impact for the school. In the past years, funds from this program have been given to help purchase a bus, make classroom renovations, and upgrade the sound equipment in the gym.



Vouchers can currently be purchased from Loblaws, No Frills, Superstore (and can be redeemed at the gas bar), Tim Hortons, and Foodland.
