Memory Work: Psalm 139:14: *"I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; my soul knows it very well."* Memory work is due this Friday, October 10.

Phonics: SK students are reviewing letters Bb and Oo. We have finished our first decodable book, *The Mat*, and will begin a new one together this week. Look for *The Mat* coming home in your child's Take Home Folder today and ask them to do some reading for you! Grade 1s will review digraphs "sh" and "ch". There will be a spelling test this Friday: *chat, chip, chop, much, such, shut, shop, cash, fish, wish*.

Math: The SK class is sorting and patterning this week. We will be identifying, extending, and creating patterns together using a wide variety of fall items (leaves, acorns, apples, etc.). Grade 1 students have been working hard to learn the "Friends of 10 Facts". There will be a small assessment this week.

Creation Studies: We're learning all about weather and seasonal changes. As we study the earth and sky, we can't help but marvel at our incredibly creative and powerful God!

Chapel: Our class will be participating in Friday's Thanksgiving chapel! We will show pictures of the things we are thankful for. If you visit the school, take a look at our artwork on the gym lobby bulletin board.

Phonics: We'll review the digraphs 'sh' and 'ch' this week.

Spelling: chat, chip, chop, much, such, shut, shop, cash, fish, wish

Memory Work: *"Oh give thanks to the LORD, for He is good; for His steadfast love endures forever!"*-Chronicles 16:34 (ESV).

Math: We'll have a quiz on the "Friends of 10" this week, with questions like $7 + \underline{\quad} = 10$, $\underline{\quad} + 4 = 10$. Trying singing our song to the tune of Frere Jacques: *"10 and 0, 9 and 1, 8 and 2 (repeat), 7 and 3, 6 and 4, 5 and 5 (repeat)."*

See how your family can support math learning this Thanksgiving through board games or everyday discussions (*We have 2 plates on the table, how many more do we need? If we invite these 3 families, how many guests will we have for Thanksgiving? Which bowl will hold the most stuffing?*).

Science: We are studying the sun, temperature, and different types of clouds over the next weeks! We will be tracing shadows to mark the movement of the sun, checking the temperature outdoors, and creating cotton ball cumulus, stratus and cirrus clouds.

Grade 2

Memory Work: Our Memory work for the next two weeks is from Psalm 105:1, 2. ***Give thanks to the Lord, call on his name; proclaim his deeds among the peoples. Sing to him, sing praise to him; tell about all his wondrous works.*** I will listen to these verses on Friday, October, 10.

Bible: We will finish up our look at the time between the Old and New Testament this week and have a unit test on Thursday.

Phonics: For the next three weeks we will focus on final blends (blends that end a word) with t, l and s and final blends -mp, -nd and -nch. Our high frequency words this week are: who, what, where, why and when.

Spelling: The spelling words for this week are: **quilt, shelf, must, chant, stand, damp, crunch, who, what, and where.** Our spelling test will be on Friday, October 10.

Math: We have been busy learning some strategies for adding numbers quickly in our head. We will have an addition quiz on Tuesday and then we will see how these strategies can be used to subtract numbers mentally as well.

Writing: This week we will look at exclamatory sentences. When do you need to use an exclamation mark as punctuation?

Science: Gases are one of the more mysterious states of matter created by God. They are quite often invisible but they still play a very important role in our lives. This week we will look at the properties of gases.

Social Studies: This Tuesday is our Field Trip to Wyoming. Thank you to those parents that have volunteered to help out with our groups as they walk around town. We will leave on the bus at 11:45 and be at the Wyoming park for a 12:30 lunch before breaking into our groups at 12:45.

Phys Ed: We have been learning so much about our soccer skills from Mrs. Huizinga. I have noticed so much improvement in our control of the ball. Phys Ed is on Monday and Friday right now so please ensure your child is wearing proper footwear for these days.



Classroom News

Grade 3

Memory Work: Genesis 1:27-28. *"So God created man in His own image; He created him in the image of God; He created them male and female. God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful, multiply, fill the earth, and subdue it. Rule the fish of the sea, the birds of the sky, and every creature that crawls on the earth."* Students may orally recite the verse or complete a "fill in the blank."

Bible: This week, we begin our next unit, continuing past creation into The Fall and moving to the Tower of Babel. This is another shorter unit of study.

Spelling: This week's words are: your, new, music, under, such, much, use, you, unit, cute. Words can also be found on the back of the "This Week in Grade 3" page.

Creation Studies: This week, students will work towards identifying 5-10 trees native to Ontario, exploring the role of trees as decomposers, and examining the benefits trees provide to animals and people, as well as the importance of tree conservation. We will be wrapping up this unit by the end of the week, concluding with a review of our science unit on Friday. Next Tuesday, October 7th, will be our unit test for this course. A review sheet will be sent home on Monday to provide a whole week of study preparation.

Writing: This week, we will focus our writing time on things we are thankful for and creating a writing piece based on our favourite Thanksgiving dessert.

Reading: We have been working alongside our science unit as we read and discuss short stories or information related to trees. We will complete this study this week and move on to a new study, "My Story," next week.

Thank you to those who joined us on our field trip this past Friday! We had a wonderful time learning about different trees of Ontario and exploring the beautiful creation of God.

Math: We will finish up our addition and number pattern unit this week and then move on to subtraction. If you want to review for our final assessment in addition you can practice 3-digit + 3-digit equations (they can use a number line if needed) like:

We had a great afternoon at the Marthaville Habitat Nature Preserve last week. Thank you to those who helped out for the afternoon! The students enjoyed this outdoor science class and some play time, too.

Over the weekend I sent out a group email, please let me know if you did not receive it!

Bible: We will continue learning about the Judges.

Memory work: *Trust the Lord My son, don't forget my teaching, but let your heart keep my commands; for they will bring you many days, a full life, and well-being. Never let loyalty and faithfulness leave you. Tie them around your neck; write them on the tablet of your heart. Then you will find favour and high regard with God and people. Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not rely on your own understanding; 6 in all your ways know him, and he will make your paths straight.* Proverbs 3:1-6 We will have a fill-in-the-blank test on verses 1 and 2 on Friday.

Writing: We reviewed the writing process and started to write an expository essay. Students were asked to write an essay to explain *how* to do an activity that they enjoy.

Spelling: Lesson 4 - adding the morphemes -er and -or. The words and the rules they need to know are in their spelling lexicon (which is in their take-home folder). We will have a test this Friday.

Literature: We will begin chapter 3 in our novel study, *Owls in the Family*, by Farley Mowat.

Math: Addition tests have been returned today. We will continue subtraction with borrowing throughout this week.

Science: On Wednesday the students will have a final test on our unit, 'Habitats and Communities'. We will review the material in class and a review was sent home today.

Grade Four French (Madame DeBoer): We continue to lay the groundwork for our class play with vocabulary and verb acquisition.

Grade 5

Happy October!

Here is what is upcoming in our curriculum for week 6!

Spelling: New spelling words will come home on Monday. Our morphemes of the week are 'er' and 'or'. Students will be given the rules that show how to add 'er' and 'or' to words and how that changes the meaning of those words.

Writing: Students will continue to finish their first draft of their opinion essay.

Math: Our third math quiz will be on Friday. The quiz will cover multiplying by the 11 and 12 times tables as well as double-digit multiplication.

Literature: We will continue "From Anna" by Jean Little. We will be reading throughout the week and completing different reading comprehension activities.

Music: Continuing with instrument classification and music theory with note values.

Physical Education: We will begin a volleyball unit.

Grade Five French (Madame DeBoer): As we learn the play, we begin to understand the vocabulary and grammar structure better. We are doing "choose the better word" exercises in class together.

Mrs. Raja

Bible: Our new unit is 'God's Covenant People,' where we will explore the stories of Abraham, Noah, and David. We will review God's promise of salvation along with his covenants with Israel and Judah. Unit #1 Bible tests will come home this week. Discussing how to break down review content and study incrementally over a week is beneficial to every student.

We will have a quiz on 'Forces Acting on Structures' on Friday. Students will be required to know internal/external forces, as well as shell/frame/solid structures, along with static/dynamic loads.

Memory work will be recited in two weeks. Jeremiah 31:33-34

Science: There's a 'Kinex: Be an Engineer Challenge', along with a final hands-on project. The culminating project will see students building their own structures using stick-and-joint designs made from household items. We will then test how their structures withstand a variety of forces and loads. This work will be completed at school.

Students will be assessed on the following:

- Creating a solid plan based on thorough research and design.
- Assembling the structure safely and with good attention to detail
- Justifying their design choices and elements.
- Applying the concepts of tension, compression, and load to analyze their structures' feat/failure.
- Identifying ways in which their design decisions contributed to the success and failure of their structure.

Math: I've decided to shift gears in math and introduce grade 6 to our probability unit. Along side this, we will daily review number operations to prepare them for heavier units to come. There will be a small quiz on probability on **Friday**.

Bible: Students will be finishing up their illustrated assessment in class this week. We will also conclude our unit on the story of the bible by meditating on God's faithfulness. There will be a couple culminating assignments given out next week.

Art: Mushroom art will be due next **Monday**. We aim on finishing our 3-d art by Friday so that students can take them home for Thanksgiving!

Have a look at what we will be covering this week.

Memory Work 1 Thessalonians 5: 9-22
Genesis 22: 16-18

Bible: We will be studying the Patriarchs, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob and God's promise that all people would be blessed through them. Then we will be looking at God saving his people out of slavery.

Math: Monday we will be reviewing factoring, finding multiples and lowest common multiples, exponents, and order of operations for a test on Chapter one on **Tuesday**. Thursday and Friday we will be looking at ratio relationships and solving ratio problems.

Language Arts: Continuing to look at the story "Operation Survival" and honouring creation through standing in awe of His creation. We will also be working on writing a Haiku inspired by God's creation.

History: We are finishing up our unit on the History of Canada from 1713-1800 by looking at The Treaty of Paris, the Royal Proclamation, Quebec Act, and American Revolution leading to the Constitutional act of 1791.

Geography: Finishing off our unit "This is Our Father's World" by looking at biomes and population density.

Music: Singing hymns, and spiritual songs for Bible class, as well as continuing to look at ledger line notes.

Physical Education: Working on the forearm pass, volley set, and serving while focusing on team work and honouring Christ through our actions.

Art and Penmanship: This week, we will complete our art project on African patterns and add a special blessing for Africa in Zulu, one of the African languages.

Science: This week, we will begin our first science unit on life systems and environmental interactions by reviewing key vocabulary and exploring the elements of the ecosystem.

We'll be focusing on the following topics during our lessons this week:
