Here are our learning goals for the first week of April!

**Phonics:** This week we are looking at words with a long "a" sound and a silent e at the end. Ex. cake, rake, make, plate, shake etc.

Spelling: made, make, came, take, safe, game, brave, grapes, shape, skate

Memory work: A review of the past few weeks:

Isaiah 43:1b-3

you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you.

Bible: The resurrection, Jesus appears to many people, and the ascension

**Creation Studies:** Continuing our study on Ecuador by learning about landforms, houses, jobs, plants and animals.

French: Continuing a unit on numbers.

**Math:** A new unit featuring numbers up to 50. It will involve ordering numbers and skip counting. If you get a chance, you can practice skip counting by 2s, 5s, and 10s, up to 50 at home with your student.

Literacy Centres: Continuing literacy centres and reading groups.

**Poetry:** We are beginning school-wide speeches. For primary-aged students, that means poetry. Parents, please help your child choose a Bible passage or a poem that has a positive theme and is 8-12 lines long that students can memorize the piece and use actions and props to enhance their presentation. Please let me know what you have chosen and send me a copy by April 15. Your child will be given some class time to work on memorizing and practicing. We will be having classroom presentations the week of April 30th. One student from the class will be chosen to present in the gym on May 6th. A rubric will be coming home today as well.

**Thursday:** I am away for most of the day on Thursday with the chess team, so a supply will be in to cover the class.

## Grade 1 (B)

#### Miss Konzelmann

**Phonics:** This week, we'll be studying words with the long "a" sound. In these words, the long vowel sound is created by the silent 'e' at the end of the word.

Spelling: Test this Friday: made, make, came, take, safe, game, brave grapes, shape, skate

Memory work: We will review the last three verses of our recent passage from Isaiah 43: 1-3

I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters,

I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you;

when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you.

For I am the Lord your God, the Holy one of Israel, your Saviour.

**Bible:** We will finish our Easter unit this week by learning more about Christ defeating death and his ascension to Heaven.

**Math:** The class did an excellent job with their graphing test. We will now be moving on to numbers to 50. This includes skip counting by 2s, 5s, and 10s as well as ordering and comparing numbers.

**Social Studies:** Our class had a blast with the other Grade 1s as we boarded our flight to Ecuador. The class learned how to prepare for their trip by researching the forecast and discussing Ecuador's climate. This week, we will talk more about the special landforms of Ecuador as well as discussing common jobs and homes of Ecuador.

Writing: Students are working very hard on their stories. We hope to finish them up this week!

Music: We will focus on our presentation for Grand Friends this week!

**Poetry Presentations:** Speechfest is coming up in the first week of May. As a primary class, we are asking that all students prepare a poem to memorize and share in front of the class. This poem may be 8-12 lines (may also be a Bible passage) and actions and props are encouraged! Please find some time to look over possible poems with your child at home. You may email me if you need extra help finding something! An info page will be included with more additional information soon!

### Grade 2

## Mrs. Ferguson

Memory Work: "I am the vine; you are the branches. The one who remains in me and I in him produces much fruit, because you can do nothing without me." John 15:5. I will listen to memory work on Friday, April 12.

**Phonics:** This week we will be studying words that end with the suffixes -ful (full of), -less (without), and -ly (in a certain way).

Spelling: Our spelling words are hopeful, playful, truthful, useful, painful, useless, restless, costly, safely, and small. Our spelling test will be on Friday, April 5.

**Math:** This week we will look at adding and subtracting coins and some word problems that go along with this. This is a great time to pull out some coins at home and practise counting them to get faster!

**Writing:** We will finish up our novel study this week and get a chance to watch the movie. Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns.

**Health:** Last week we completed our unit on Health. We have learned many ways to keep ourselves and our bodies healthy and safe. This week we will use this knowledge to create a poster or advertisement that teaches others how to be safe and/or healthy.

Speechfest: Students in grades 1-4 will recite a poem or Scripture passage from memory for Speechfest. In grade 2 our passage or poem must be 8-12 lines in length. A copy of your chosen passage/poem must be sent to the school by April 15 for approval. If you need some ideas, we have a binder of poems at the school. These will be presented in our class on April 30 and one student will be chosen to represent our class at Speechfest on May 6 at 1:45. If you have any questions, feel free to e-mail or text me.

### **Grade 3**

#### Mrs. Bouma

Spelling: There will be no spelling list this week!

**Reading:** There are so many amazing structures around us! We thank God for creating so many things to build with and giving us the creativity to build! We look forward to reading more about amazing structures this week.

**Math**: We continue on with our Perimeter and Area unit. We will be comparing them and using them to measure zoo exhibits in the coming week.

French: We will have fun using our prepositions this week: sous (under), sur (on), devant (beside), and derriere (behind).

Music: We will be reading about and listening to Pachelbel this week!

Memory Work: "Then the cloud covered the tent of meeting, and the glory of the LORD filled the tabernacle...throughout all their journeys, whenever the cloud was taken up from over the tabernacle, the people of Israel would set out. But if the cloud was not taken up, then they did not set out till the day that it was taken up. For the cloud of the LORD was on the tabernacle by day, and fire was in it by night, in the sight of all the house of Israel throughout all their journeys." Exodus 40: 34, 36-38. This memory verse will take a few weeks. It connects to our new unit on The Tabernacle.

**Bible:** We are beginning our new unit on the Tabernacle. This week we will look at the relationship of God's presence in the Old Testament, and the symbols that were used.

**Science:** We are continuing to learn about structures. We are talking about bracing and strengthening our structures to withstand forces. This week we will focus on the 5 basic types of bridges. In groups the students will work to construct a bridge from various materials.

**Writers Workshop:** Students will be completing their short-stories. They have worked diligently to create a story with a clear setting, plot, conflict and resolution. We will be sharing our stories with the class and a younger grade.

**Grammar:** We will begin looking at onomatopoeias, words such as, bang and pop! Students will create a comic strip using onomatopoeias, connecting this term to our writing unit.

## Grade 4

#### Mrs. Noordam

**Bible:** Tests have been returned today. We begin a unit on Psalms and Proverbs. Lesson 1 discusses how Psalms can be seen as prayers, songs, and poetry.

**Grammar:** We concluded our adverb unit and will begin a unit on prepositions.

**Spelling:** Lesson 26 test on Friday.

Math: We finished learning about mass(grams and kilograms) and we will focus on capacity this week.

**Science:** Last week we created a pinhole camera! We also worked on a science experiment demonstrating about how light reflects off objects. Students experimented with aluminum foil and pondered the question, "What does light do on different surfaces?" We observed and had a great discussion! This week we will discuss the total solar eclipse coming up on April 8.

**Please note:** I sent an email to all parents on Thursday (March 28) about the upcoming Speechfest. I also sent home a paper copy (yellow) with the information. Please reach out if you have any questions!

French (Madame DeBoer): This week we begin to answer partial questions about the play; where the students need to come up with the answer themselves! We are also solidifying our roles & groups for the play. A lot of the students are well on their way to memorizing the play-bon travail!

### **Grade 5**

### Mrs. Raja

He is risen. He is risen indeed! Death could not hold him, and today we serve a risen saviour! Thanks be to God.

April is a BIG month. We have the eclipse, speeches, our Spring Showcase, track and field prep, and so much more! Our class also has students participating in the chess tournament and Battle of the Books! I love it when children discover their strengths and dive into their hobbies.

For speeches, our goal is to be finished writing by next Friday. This gives me the opportunity to add final revisions over the weekend and the class roughly two weeks for practice. It is a tight deadline. Some may require support from home, but all will need some encouragement. If research could be done at home, then we can focus on the writing in class.

This week we will learn about four different forms of government: theocracy, democracy, dictatorship, and consensus. If you hear any rumblings about inequality in the classroom, it is for the sole purpose of understanding, in a practical manner, just how each type of government operates. The end goal is to create students who are knowledgeable and feel a sense of responsibility for the manner in which we are governed- to be steered with justice and integrity in the process.

**French (Madame DeBoer):** We started story retelling in partners and the goal is to write as long of stories as possible! It's amazing to see how much language they have learned as they attempt to retell the story of the play in different words. Please have your child start taking their play home to memorize their part.

### **Grade 6**

**Gym:** We have completed our unit on pickleball. We will start this week by getting back into shape and preparing for track and field. Grade 6 will be introduced to shot put and triple jump this week. Every other week until track and field, we will focus on improving our skills in various events. ### Grade 7

#### **Miss Hotke**

He is Risen! I hope you all had a wonderful, restful Easter weekend! Here is a look at what is to come this week.

**Bible:** Last week we finished lessons 1-7 on Job. We will review the lessons today and our test will be on **Thursday**. Students already have review sheets. Our memory work for this week is found in **Proverbs 3:27-30**. We will have a quiz over these verses on **Friday, April 12**.

**Math:** This week we will continue working on Chapter 7: 2D Geometry. Students will have homework each night but will also be given time during class to work on it.

Science: We will continue working through our unit on 'The Amazing Atmosphere!'

**Music:** We will begin working on memorizing the graduation and Grandfriend's song: My God Is All I Need, My God Is So Big by CityAlight. We will use some of this time to work on our Grandfriend's presentation and speeches for our Spring Showcase.

**Literature/Writing:** We will continue our study of the novel *Lost in the Barrens* by Farley Mowat. On **Thursday** we will have a quiz over Chapters 9-16.

**History:** We will continue working through the unit on The Middle Ages. Students have chosen a topic for their history project and a way of presenting their findings. I will give them time in class to work on completing their project. More details to follow.

Phys. Ed: This week we will start into another intramural sport.

**Silent Reading:** The students need to continue bringing books to school for silent reading time, or keep a book in their desk from library time. Some days I allow them to complete their homework instead of reading.

French (Madame DeBoer): We continue to practice the verb devoir, adjectives and possessive adjectives as we begin a small unit project (introduced this week) on les microbes. We also have a listening quiz (no prep required!) on Thursday; if you do not have headphones at school, please bring a pair that day for this.

## **Grade 8**

### Miss Hiemstra

**Bible** - Last week, we learned about the Feast of Weeks/Shavuot, the Feast of Trumpets/Rosh Hashanah, and the Day of Atonement/Yom Kippur on the Jewish calendar. This week, we'll continue to study the Jewish feasts, moving on to look at the Feast of Tabernacles and Purim.

Music - This week, we'll be starting to look at potential song selections to play on Grandfriends' Day!

Science - We are continuing our study of solutions and mixtures. Having learned about saturation, distillation, and concentration last week, we'll be moving on to look at different types of solutions and the role of water as the universal solvent.

**History** - We are continuing to work through our study of the Middle Ages. This week, we will be looking at the Crusades.

Math - We are finishing up Unit 8 this week on using equations to represent and solve problems.

#### Mrs. Koetsier

**Geography:** We began our new chapter, "Understanding Quality of Life", with an assignment to help us focus on what "quality of life" refers to, some investigation of data on food bank use in Ontario, and some Biblical perspective on these issues. We'll continue with that this week.

Writing: Students have been given a rubric for grading and expectations, and have received feedback on outlines for their speeches. Students are reminded that an important component of their speeches is how well they connect their topics to the Christian faith - it must be something that is woven through the entire speech, not just a mention in the conclusion. They'll begin working on a rough copy this week. Please do discuss these and give ideas and encouragement to your students at home! A great way to get ideas is to check out videos of winning speeches via Toastmasters International, TedTalks or other public speaking organizations.

Literature: I'm VERY excited to pass on that we'll begin our "Literature Circles" small group novel study, on the theme of prejudice, this week! This is an excellent way for your child to experience a new novel, develop vocabulary, writing and comprehension skills, become more aware of what prejudice looks like and what our Christian response should be, and to work on collaboration within a group. Students will be able to indicate a first, second and third choice from the following list of novels: Roll of Thunder, Hear My Cry by Mildred Taylor, The Slave Dancer by Paula Fox, Esperenza Rising by Pamela Munoz Ryan, Front Desk by Kelly Yang, and My Name is Not Angelica by Scott O'Dell. Students will be formed into groups based on their choices as well as other considerations:), and will work through the novel and the assignments as a group. There will be homework, as well as a "two strike" philosophy for its completion - if a student is not prepared for his/her group discussion because their work is not done the first time an alternate assignment will be given. If it happens again he/she will be removed from the group permanently and will need to complete alternate assignments and work on his/her own for the duration of the unit. The same consequence will be given if a student is struggling to be an effective group member. Assignments for group activities will see each student taking turns performing a different "role" each day for discussion purposes, keeping up with assigned reading, individual journal and other assignments, and a culminating art activity.
