Memory Work: Psalm 95:1-7

Bible: Jacob and Esau Meet Again - Genesis 29 Joseph's Colourful Robe - Genesis 37

Weekly Theme: We are going to focus on trees and fall leaves during this shortened week. There are some wonderful picture books to read including *The Leaf Thief*, *Leaf Man*, and *We're Going On A Leaf Hunt*. We have already seen some beautiful fall leaves that students have brought in for show and tell. Look for the leaf theme to show up in our math, language and art activities this week.

Math: Students have been sorting and patterning fall things. While JK students have been mastering a simple AB pattern, the SK crew has been working on more complex patterns. We are learning to identify the pattern core and to describe the pattern type with an alphabet name. (AB, ABC, AAB...) Patterning continues this week.

Language: The SK decodable reader, "A Bat, A Rat And A Ram" will be coming home later this week. We have taken particular notice of the word "is" in this little booklet. We are also learning to track the words with our finger as we read. Take some time to review this reader at home!

Scissor Skills: We often use scissors in KinderStart! The JK students are learning to perfect their scissor skills. There will be some scissor skill practice sheets coming home in the next month on Thursdays as an alternate activity to the daily planner printing.

Emergency Clothes: With the arrival of cooler weather, it might be a good idea to check your child's emergency clothes. If you have sent shorts, you may want to exchange them with a pair of pants. It is also a good idea to tuck an extra pair of socks into a pocket of your child's backpack.

Fall Walk: Both classes will be looking for signs of fall as we explore the outdoors next week. The JK class will explore our school yard as well as our neighbours, Mr and Mrs. Schenk on Thursday, October 23. The SK group will visit Mr. and Mrs. Pelleboer's bush with Miss Jackson's class to find items on a fall scavenger hunt on Friday, October 24.

Senior Kinderstart (B) / Grade 1 (B)

Memory Work: Philippians 4:19: "And my God will supply every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus." SK and Grade 1 students will recite this memory work on Friday, October 24.

Phonics: SK students are reviewing letters Pp and Cc this week. Grade 1 continues to learn digraphs, focusing on digraphs /th/ and /wh/ while also reviewing /sh/ and /ch/. Due to the short week, we will not have a spelling test this Friday.

Math: In SK we continue identifying, extending, and creating patterns. Grade 1 students continue to study Addition to 10. We are learning a variety of strategies for adding numbers together such as number lines, ten-frames, and pictures.

Bible: As we wrap up our unit on Abraham, we've seen God's faithfulness to Abraham and his family. This week we begin a new unit on Isaac and Jacob.

Field Trip: Our trip to the London Children's Museum is tomorrow! We will be leaving the school at 9:00 and returning by 3:00. Students need to bring a water bottle and a lunch bag. I will bring students' extra clothes bags so if you haven't sent one to school yet, please do so by tomorrow. If you plan to drive your child to or from the museum, please let Mrs. Jackson know. We're looking forward to a great trip!

Fall Walk: We've been learning all about the changing seasons and weather over the last few weeks. Next Friday afternoon, we'll be taking our learning outside of the classroom with a trip to the Pelleboer's where we'll explore the signs of fall with the SK-A class.

Grade 1

Field Trip: The week has finally arrived — we're off to the Children's Museum on Wednesday! We'll be leaving school at 9:00 a.m. and returning by 3:00 p.m. Students should bring a water bottle and lunch bag for the day. I'll bring the extra clothing bags, but please send one to school if you haven't already. A big thank-you to our wonderful parent volunteers — we're so grateful to have such great supervision for this trip. If you plan to drive your child to or from the museum, please let Mrs. Jackson know. We're looking forward to a fun day of playing, learning, and exploring!

Memory Work: God is a pattern-maker and cares for His world! We're learning about the cycles of seasons and days and nights, and this verse reminds us of how God shows His faithfulness and love for us in the rhythms of creation. We will have two weeks to learn Genesis 8:22: "While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease."

Math: We are studying Addition to 10. We will learn various strategies for addition, like using counters, pictures, or a number line.

Phonics: Our focus will be on the /th/ and /wh/ digraphs and reviewing /ch/ and /sh/.

Spelling: We will not have a test due to the short week and the field trip.

Book Bags: Students should bring in their book bags every Tuesday so they can get a new levelled reader! Mrs. Noorloos will read with our growing readers every week!

Grade 2

Mrs. Ferguson

Bible: In our next unit we see how God kept His promise to send a Messiah. Jesus is the fulfilment of the old testament prophecy of the coming Saviour.

Memory Work: Our memory work comes from our theme for the year. This month we are looking at how God is our Provider. Philippians 4:19 tells us; "And my God will supply all my needs according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus." I will listen to this verse on Friday October 24.

Math: This week we will look at strategies to help us subtract numbers quickly. We will also see how addition facts and subtraction facts are related and use this to help us.

Phonics: For the next two weeks we will be working on the "glued" sounds -ing, -ang, -ong, -ung, -ink, -ank, -onk, -unk. We call these "glued" sounds because when these letters appear together in a word, we cannot hear the individual sound made by each one of the three letters. Our high frequency words for this week are could, would and should.

Spelling: Our spelling words this week are: **string, hang, long, swung, blink, drank, honk, trunk, would** and **could.** Our spelling test will be on Friday October 17.

Science: We had fun making ice cream last week as we looked at how liquids can be turned into solids by freezing. We will do some more experiments to learn about evaporation, condensation and melting.

Social Studies: Canada is made up of people that come from many different countries. We will look at the difference between culture and heritage and see how some of our traditions come from where our ancestors lived. 'A Cultural Scrapbook Project' is coming home with your child today. This can be completed on the pages I provided or your child can choose to present the information in another way (video, poster).

Phys Ed: I would like to thank Evelyn Huizinga for working with us over the last month as we learned some very important soccer skills. This week we will move indoors and work on balance and body control.

Grade 3 A

Mrs. Lofgren

I hope you all had a wonderful Thanksgiving weekend with your families! It was a wonderful time of reflection on God's provision in our lives and His blessings upon us.

Memory Work: Genesis 8:22 – "As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, and day and night will not cease." Students may orally recite the verse or complete a "fill in the blank."

Bible: We will wrap up our study of the Fall until Noah this week and have a unit test on Friday. A review sheet will be going home on Tuesday to help prepare.

Spelling: This week's words are: glasses, movies, tomatoes, cherries, babies, boxes, highways, countries. Words can also be found on the back of the "This Week in Grade 3" page.

Creation Studies: We are sad to "leaf" our study on trees and seeds this week. Our unit test has been moved to Wednesday, with a review of the unit on Tuesday. The review sheets went home on Wednesday of last week. If you need another review package, please let me know, and I will send it by email. By the end of the week, we will begin our new study on 'Historical Communities'. Look for a newsletter on Friday that will include some homework to complete.

Writing: We will be participating in Pen Pals with a Grade 3 class from Strathroy Christian School. This week, our writing focus will be on writing our first letter to our pals, introducing ourselves, and preparing questions to learn more about them.

Math: We have gotten off to a good start in our subtraction unit. Regrouping when subtracting can be a tricky concept. In class we are using this rhyme to help us to know when to regroup: *More on top, no need to stop. More on the floor, go next door and borrow 1 more.* Take a few minutes this week to practice some 3-digit subtraction with your child:

Grade 4

Memory work: Trust the Lord my son, don't forget my teaching, but let your heart keep my commands; for they will bring you many days, a full life, and well-being. Never let loyalty and faithfulness leave you. Tie them around your neck; write them on the tablet of your heart. Then you will find favour and high regard with God and people. Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not rely on your own understanding; in all your ways know him, and he will make your paths straight. Proverbs 3:1-6

We will have a fill-in-the-blank test on verses 3 and 4 next Friday.

Bible: We will read in Judges 6 how the Lord called Gideon to be Israel's next judge.

Science: Students completed the 'Habitats and Communities' unit and group projects. The final tests and rubrics for the group projects will be sent home this week. We will take a break from science and begin our first social studies unit. This unit is titled 'Ancient Farming Communities'. In this unit the students will be introduced to the daily lives of the people of ancient farming communities of Egypt and China. They will learn to recognize the creativity of people, how they were constructive, and how cooperation was essential for survival.

Writing and Grammar: We are finishing up our good copies of our expository essays.

Literature: We will begin chapter 5 in our novel study, *Owls in the Family*, by Farley Mowat. Throughout this study, we will be learning new vocabulary words.

Spelling: In Lesson 6, we will focus on the suffixes -ion and -tion. The words and the rules they need to know are in their spelling lexicon. We will have a test this Friday.

Math: The students had an assessment on the concept of borrowing in subtraction before the long weekend break. Look for those in their take-home folders. Our next focus will be on using addition and subtraction skills to answer problem-solving questions.

Grade 5

Happy Thanksgiving! I hope everyone enjoyed the long Thanksgiving weekend! We have so much to be thankful for! I am thankful for each one of your students who make up our Grade 5 classroom! They are each so unique, and it is a privilege to watch them grow, learn, and know God more!

Here is what is upcoming in our curriculum for week 7!

Spelling: New spelling words will come home on Tuesday. Our morpheme of the week is "ion". Students will be given the rules that show how to add "ion" to words and how that changes the meaning of those words.

Writing: Students will finish their first draft of their opinion essay and begin to peer edit each other's essays.

Math: We will continue with 2-digit by 2-digit multiplication this week. We will practice doing various multiplication problems to solidify our understanding of how to complete this type of math problem.

Literature: We will continue "From Anna" by Jean Little. Students will finish their drawings of Anna's classroom, and we will continue to read as we discover what life was like for Anna after she moved to Canada.

Music: We will complete a music listening log activity together.

Physical Education: We will continue to learn and practice various volleyball skills.

I am looking forward to a great week!

Grade Five French (Madame DeBoer): As we learn the play, we begin to understand the vocabulary and grammar structure better. We are doing "choose the better word" exercises in class together.

Last week was quite busy as we wrapped up MAP testing and participated in cross-country meets. We will proceed with our plans to conduct a hands-on demonstration of the forces acting on a structure. This activity will take place on Wednesday and will last for two periods, followed by another period to record and convey our data. In Bible, we look to Abraham to dig deeper in understanding the power and privilege of God's covenant with His chosen people. The class thoroughly enjoyed their introduction to printmaking and would like to continue creating more prints with their moulds this week.

So, now onto what we have planned for this week:

Wednesday, October 15 at the Pinery. This will be a full day of learning from the experts about endangered animals in Ontario, invasive species and much more! Memory: Over the next few weeks we will be learning Colossians 1: 15-20. This is a beautiful paragraph about the deity of Christ. It is long, so we will break it up, verse by verse. Spelling: This week students will be introduced to our October commonly misspelt words.

Writing: I hope to finish up learning about diamante poems this week and having students write and submit their own.

Science: The last thing for us to study in our biodiversity unit will be invasive species. We will learn this week what they are and begin to conduct some research on a few in order to present our finding to the class next week.

Math: This week we will be learning how to round and estimate to add and subtract whole numbers. Students will also be introduced to our new unit on angles.

Bible: Bible test will be on Friday. I aim to have a study sheet created for students to take home today after school. Students are also working on writing their own psalm to the Lord based on Psalm 136. The goal is to make these individualized Psalms both beautifully written and beautifully looking by using some calligraphy skills.

Art: Part of our time in art will be learning calligraphy through our individualized Psalms. If we have more time, then we will begin to learn about Rembrandt, his story and his paintings.

Memory Work: 1 Thessalonians 5: 9-22

Bible: We will be continuing to look at God saving his people out of slavery and also the law given by God to Moses and the Israelites.

Math: We are continuing to review order of operations and looking at ratios and rates.

Language Arts: Continuing with writing Haiku's inspired by God's creation and looking at how we can honour God's creation by seeing it from other's perspectives. We will be rewriting scenarios under differing perspectives.

Music: We will begin looking at tone chimes this week.

Physical Education: We will keep working on serving in volleyball. On the defensive end, we are working on moving our feet to receive the ball, and directing the ball to the setter who will attempt to pass the ball for a spike.

Science: This week, we'll explore how abiotic and biotic components interact within an ecosystem and examine how energy is transferred through a food chain.

Art: This week, we'll finish our African art pattern projects and begin our first artist study in art appreciation: Marc Chagall, a dreamlike, colourful, and imaginative artist.

Here are a few dates to take note of this week:

Wednesday, October 15: Class trip to Lambton Museum.

Friday, October 17: Math quiz on fractions Tuesday, October 21: End-of-unit Bible test

Here are a few of our curriculum focuses this week:

Bible: This week, we will conclude our first Bible unit on the early church by exploring the book of Acts, where Jesus sends the Holy Spirit to continue His work through His disciples. We will also learn about the different Jewish sects as we study the growth of the early church. An end-of-unit Bible test will take place on Tuesday, October 21.

Memory work: Ephesians 4:29-31

Math: We are continuing our work on adding and subtracting fractions this week. There will be a short quiz on Friday to check students' understanding.

History: We will first be reviewing Canada's early history from 1000AD through to 1857. Then we will be researching and presenting on the different colonies in Canada from 1840 to 1867. Students will describe the geological area, discover the resources the colonies would have used, and find out which people were of significance.

Geography: We will be examining what are the various settlement factors that cause people to live where they do and then looking at the settlement patterns as well.

Physical Education: We will keep working on serving in volleyball. On the defensive end, we are working on moving our feet to receive the ball, and directing the ball to the setter who will attempt to pass the ball for a spike.

Literature: We will finish our compare-and-contrast essay on *A Long Walk to Water* and take time to reflect on Remembrance Day as it approaches. Students will also create a poster to commemorate it.

Art: We will finish our landscape and silhouette art piece on *A Long Walk to Water*.

Grade Eight French (Madame DeBoer): We will have a quiz on the verbs vouloir, pouvoir and devoir Thursday, October 16th.
