Grade 1 (A)

Thank you for continuing to support your child and their learning each week!

Here are some of our learning goals for this week!

Phonics: This week we are looking at words with a long 'o' sound and a silent 'e' at the end. **Ex.** home, rode, woke, etc.

Spelling: home, note, globe, rode, woke, drove, smoke, froze, saw, one

Memory work: We are continuing to practice our verses for our chapel, Isaiah 43:1b-3 as well as our weekly verses from last week: Acts 17:26.

Bible: After returning to finish our unit on the life of David, we are now going to learn about his son, Solomon. We will see what Solomon's peaceful reign was like, in contrast to David's reign full of conflict.

Creation Studies: Students will be finishing their non-fiction report on their animal from Ecuador as well as learning more about the people of Ecuador and their jobs and lives.

Writing: We will be finishing our non-fiction writing.

French: We will continue our unit on numbers using our "Mini prof" approach.

Math: We will be finishing up our unit on numbers up to 50. We will have a quiz on Tuesday and then we will begin a short unit on all the different aspects of calendars.

Literacy Centres: We will be continuing literacy centres and reading groups.

Poetry: We will begin practicing our poems!

Chapel: This week, Thursday at 1:40pm, the Grade 1A and Grade 2 classes will be hosting a chapel. Our Grade 1 class will be saying a verse at the chapel and possibly leading the singing of one of our songs.

Grade 1 (B)

Phonics: This week, we'll be studying words with the long 'o' sound. In these words, the long vowel sound is created by the silent 'e' at the end of the word.

Spelling: home, note, globe, rode, woke, drove froze, smoke, saw*, one*

Memory work: They will be asked to recite the verse next Tuesday. Acts 17:26: From one man he made all the nations, that they should inhabit the whole earth; and he marked out their appointed times in history and the boundaries of their lands.

Bible: We will wrap up our unit with David this week with a test on Friday.

Math: We will have a quick review of calendar facts (days of the week, months of the year, and seasons) before we begin our unit on Money!

Socials: We had a blast with the Gr. 1 A class last week as the students were able to go on an Ecuador wildlife scavenger hunt. They had to find different animals and match it to their sheet. They also had a lovely time building their houses. This week we will be focusing on our Ecuadorian animal research projects. On Wednesday, Alyssa DeGroot has offered to come share with the class of her past trips to Ecuador! We are excited to hear about her travels.

Writing: Students chose an animal from Ecuador to research and will now begin to write some non-fiction writing pieces to go along with their research. Last week they finished up their fiction stories, and students will be given a chance to read them to the class this week! Great work class!

Music: We continue to practice Boomwhackers for our performance for Grandfriends' Day!

Art: We have been completing a few art pieces inspired by Ecuadorian culture and wildlife. Students completed gorgeous sea turtle pastel work and just completed a piece with weaving yarn! They have been doing an excellent job with completing these pieces.

Poems: Please send your child with their poem to school tomorrow for those of you who have not done so yet! The due date was today and the poems need to be sent in so they can be approved before beginning to memorize them! This poem can be a scripture passage as well and needs to be within 8-12 lines. Please send me an email if you need help picking a poem with your child. They will be given some class time to practice, but the majority of the memorizing will have to be done at home.

Grade 2

Memory Work: There will be no memory work this week to give us time to work on our Poetry recitation piece and to memorize the words to our Grandfriends' songs.

Bible: Last week we finished up our unit on the Parables of Jesus. This week we will wrap up this unit by working in groups to act out one of these parables.

Phonics: This week we will look at r-controlled vowel words with the patterns -er, -eer, and -ear.

Spelling: Our spelling words are clerk, sternly, letter, number, serve, ear, hear, fearful, dear and deer. Our spelling test will be on Friday, April 19.

Math: We will finish up our unit on money with a quiz today. The next unit looks at time. We begin by measuring time on non-standard units like claps or snaps, then we will look at measuring time in hours, minutes and seconds.

Writing: We talked about opinion writing last week as we learned about the difference between a fact and an opinion. We brainstormed ideas to write about. This week we will see how to back our opinion with three solid reasons and begin to write our opinion about our topic choice. The final piece for opinion writing will be a review/persuasive piece on our favourite restaurant. This is a good time to pick a restaurant and talk about why it is their favourite.

Science: Last week we had fun learning about levers with our special guest in the outdoor classroom. We even got to build a catapult and label the parts of a lever. This week we will move onto the pulley and see how it makes work easier for us.

Field Trip: Our Field Trip to the Gordon's Dairy Farm is next Tuesday. Thank you to those that volunteered to join us. We will leave the school at 12:30 and will return around 3:00.

Speechfest: Poems were due today for approval. Our classroom recitations will be on April 30.

Grade 3

Poems: I still need a few hard copies of poems that students have picked for our Poem recitation the week of April 29. If your child has not submitted their poem yet, please do so as soon as possible.

Penpals: We got mail today! Our penpals wrote us back! We look forward to replying to their letters and sending off another round of letters.

Spelling: We are on Lesson 25 this week. The sound of "f" can be written in many ways - f, gh, ph, and lf. Take some time to practice our words this week for our test on Friday.

Reading: We will complete our reading unit on Structures this week and start our last novel study, *Sarah*, *Plain and Tall*. Ask your child to give you a summary on the chapters as we read. In our silent reading time, we have been doing some special reading. All students read a Mystery book in the last few weeks and now we are reading a Historical Fiction book. Most students have been surprised at how much they have enjoyed reading these genres.

Math: We have had a good start to our fractions unit. We will work on adding fractions, comparing fractions, equivalent fractions. and sharing (dividing) fractions as we progress through our unit.

Music: We are taking out the handbells and working on song to share with our parents and grandparents.

French: Students did a great job on our last French Test! Way to go, Grade 3. We will start our next unit this week and a new vocabulary sheet will go home by the end of the week.

Memory Work: "The earth is the Lord's, and all it contains, the world, and those who dwell in it." Psalm 24:1 Is due this Friday, April 19th. Students will be orally reciting this verse or writing it out. Last week students were quizzed on the tabernacle passage.

Science: We completed our engineering unit last week. Today we had a short quiz. Tomorrow we begin looking into God's amazing design for creation in our soil unit. This will be a very fun, hands on and practical unit for the students. Grade 4

Bible: In our current unit on Psalms and Proverbs, students have an assignment where they are asked to choose a passage from Proverbs and explain how it could apply to them. They need to use their creativity with their words and with their illustrations.

Spelling: We have a spelling test on Friday. Students' lists have been sent home.

Literacy: Students are enjoying reading the *Sign of the Beaver*! We have started to read chapter 3 today.

Math: On Tuesday there will be a math test on Area. Our next unit will be another short unit on angles, lines, and locations.

Science: We will move into the Sound section on the 'Light and Sound' unit. God's creation is full of sounds. The variety is incredible! We can hear sounds, feel sounds, (ask your child about the dancing salt!) and make sounds! French (Madame DeBoer): The roles have been chosen for our plays: please have your child memorize their parts for the play. We continue to manipulate language in the play, and we will also create masks for our characters this week.

Grade 5
