Memory Work: Psalm 95:1-7 - We are going to put all of the verses together during the next few weeks. It is a large memory work which is a wonderful reminder of who God is.

Bible: A Baby In A Basket - Exodus 1&2 The Burning Bush - Exodus 3

Shared Snack: Wednesday - Nolan Thursday - Milly

Weekly Theme: The month is November and it's "All About Me" time. We will be making special books about ourselves which will be sent home with the term one report cards later in the month. Students are asked to bring in a baby picture of themselves which we will use for a "Guess That Baby" game. Please write your child's name on the back of the picture. Everyone is also asked to return the completed "All About Me" page to school so that we can share it with the class and put it into our art books.

Handwriting: The SK class has worked through all of the uppercase letters and will complete a review of those letters this week. Following that, we will focus on proper formation of lowercase letters. This is an excellent time to remind students to print their name with only an uppercase letter at the beginning followed by lowercase letters. JK students will work on letter U as well as review numbers 1-5 on the classroom chalkboards.

Language: We will be introduced to a new decodable reader this week in SK. The students are taking a lot of pride in their reading skills! The following high frequency words can be found in this booklet: is, the, look and at. SK, can you find some of these high frequency words in some of your books at home? How many words can you identify? In addition to this new reader, we will also focus on ending sounds of words. We are learning to s-t-r-e-t-c-h words like a slinky as we listen for the phonemes. We will put our skills to work in our journal writing. The JK class will continue with letter and sound identification activities.

Math: Our "All About Me" unit provides wonderful opportunities to complete some data management activities! Throughout the month, we will be graphing and tallying as we obtain and compare information. Both classes will also be challenged with more number work as we strive to count, identify and print larger numbers.

Senior Kinderstart (B) / Grade 1 (B)

Memory Work: Over the next few weeks, we will learn Philippians 4:4-7. We'll begin with verses 4 and 5: "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near." We will have a check-in this Friday, November 7.

Phonics: In SK, students are reviewing letters Uu and Gg and working on identifying ending sounds of CVC words. Grade 1 continues to study digraphs, focusing on digraphs /ck/ and /qu/. There will be a spelling test on Friday: back, kick, check, thick, quit, quiz, quick, quack, each, of

Math: SK is identifying, ordering, and writing numbers 11-20. Grade 1 students begin a unit on subtraction to 10.

Creation Studies: Our *All About Me* unit begins this week in SK! For the month of November, we will be learning lots of new things about each other as we explore what makes each one of us unique. Our Grade 1 unit, *The Sky Declares*, has come to an end. We've had fun learning about the Sun, seasonal changes, and weather. There will be a small unit test this Thursday. A review page will be coming home in your child's folder today.

Bible: We are wrapping up our unit on the lives of Isaac and Jacob. God has been faithful in keeping His promises to Abraham and his family! Next, we'll begin to study the life of Joseph.

Picture Day: This Wednesday, November 5 is Picture Day for SK students. **Our class (SKs and Grade 1s) will have our class photo taken on Wednesday**. If there are any Grade 1 students who need a photo retake, please contact the school office to get added to Wednesday's retake list.

Reading Calendar: Students may return their October reading calendar to school this week for a small prize.

Show and Tell: Grade 1 students are asked to bring a show and tell item to school this Wednesday. We will use their objects as a writing prompt. SKs may bring their show and tell item on Friday.

Grade 1

Mrs. Tetreault

Phonics: We are reviewing our last 2 digraphs, /ck/ and /qu/.

Spelling: back, kick, check, thick, quit, quiz, quick, quack, each, of

Boom Game: This week I'll be sending home a copy of our BOOM game to students who may benefit from some extra practice with our term 1 high-frequency words. Your child can teach you how to play!

Calendar: Besides weather news, we'll add another feature to our morning meeting: The Shape Show! Ask your child about 3-D shapes!

Math: Our focus is subtraction using fingers, counters and a number line.

Remembrance Day: Our school will participate in the Royal Canadian Legion's Remembrance Day art competitions. We will reflect on the themes of peace and remembrance, and discuss how to communicate these themes through symbols. Students will look at posters created by past Legion contest winners for inspiration and create their own during our art period. If you haven't returned your child's permission form, please do so by Friday.

Memory Work: We will memorize a longer passage as we approach Advent and Christmas! We will begin with Luke 2: 8,9 (NIV). And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified.

Labels: Please write your child's name inside hats, gloves, boots, snowpants and jackets. They're often found strewn about the playground on warmer afternoons, and labels keep them out of the lost and found. We also typically have students in matching items (i.e. boots, black gloves) and they're easily mixed up.

Weather: We are wrapping up our 'Seasonal Changes' unit with an assessment on Wednesday. Please look for a review sheet in your child's take-home folder today.

Grade 2

Mrs. Ferguson

Memory Work: For the next months we will work on memorizing Luke 2: 8-20. We will do this in smaller sections. Our memory work will be Luke 2:8, 9 "And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified." Memory work will be tested on Friday, November 7.

Phonics: This week we will keep working on the word endings -s, -es, -ed and -ing. We learned that when we need to add -s to the end of a word (to make it plural or change the form of the verb), we use -es if the word ends in ch, s, sh, x, or z. We will also look at the different sounds that -ed makes at the end of a word.

Spelling: Our spelling words for the next two weeks are wings, drinks, passes, splashes, thinking, helping, yelled, handed, than and then. Our spelling test will be on Friday, November 7.

Math: We started Getting Ready for Multiplication and Division last week. This week we will look more at even and odd numbers and then finish the week with a unit test on Tuesday. In our next unit we will begin to look at measurement beginning with measuring things using non standard units such as craft sticks or paperclips.

Writing: We will take a closer look at describing words. How can we use our describing words to make our sentences more interesting?

Science: We move onto our next unit in Science, "God Shows us How to Move". First we will look at what movement is and how God created our bodies to move using bones, muscles and joints.

Social Studies: Our Family Cultural Scrapbooks are due this Tuesday. Please contact me if you need extra time. Thursday we will have an opportunity to present some of the information in our scrapbooks to the class. Feel free to send in any props that your child might want for this presentation.

Music: As we begin to prepare for our Christmas presentation, we will learn how to play the handbells.

Grade 3 A

Mrs. Lofgren

Memory Work: Genesis 17:9 – "God also said to Abraham, 'As for you, you and your o?spring after you throughout their generations are to keep My covenant." Students may orally recite the verse or complete a "fill in the blank." This will be due by Friday.

Bible: This week we will learn about the birth of Isaac, God's dealing with Sodom and Gomorrah, Hagar and Ishmael's fate, and God's testing of Abraham. **We will have a unit review on Monday of next week with a test on Tuesday.** A review sheet will be going home on Wednesday this week to help your child prepare for the test.

Spelling: pretty, off, zipper, carry, willing, balloon, spelling, still, added, letter. Our spelling test will be on Friday.

Creation Studies: We continue our study of the Loyalist Pioneers. This week we will look at the types of shelters the early settlers had to build and the challenging circumstances surrounding beginning a new life somewhere else. We will also be comparing what life looks like in several areas for us compared to how they lived.

Reading: We have moved on in our readers to learning and reading about the Early Settlers. This section will complement our socials unit as we continue to explore life from long ago.

Writing: This week we will learn about "popcorn writing" and how to expand our sentences.

Mrs. Bouma

Math: We will finish up our word problem unit this week. We have been looking at the wording carefully to find clues which tell us to add or subtract. We will also look at two-step problems which requires us to use two different steps to figure out the answer. Many of our equations also review our regrouping skills from previous units.

French: We will wrap up our Unité C - Ca va? this week with a test on Thursday. A bright orange review sheet is going home on Monday to help students review at home.

Spelling: Lesson 7 – pretty, off, zipper, carry, willing, balloon, spelling, still, added, letter (Fri. Nov. 7)

Math: Subtraction up to 1000 – Subtraction with regrouping from 0. Students will complete a test on this unit on Friday. A review sheet has been sent home today.

Reading: Novel Study - *The Bears on Hemlock Mountain* – Well, we read to the end of the book and Jonathan made an important discovery – there ARE bears on Hemlock Mountain. This week we'll discuss themes within the book as well as character development. We will also be doing a culminating project. Information on this has been sent home separately. We will also have a test on this novel on Wednesday, Nov. 12.

Writing: Last week we worked together as a class to write a descriptive paragraph using a photo of an angry bear! This week students will write their own paragraphs using a picture provided by their teacher.

Health: This week we'll be putting our digestive system organs together in their proper place. This will conclude our Health unit. A test is scheduled for Tuesday, Nov. 11.

French (Mrs. Bouma): We will wrap up our Unité C - Ca va? this week with a test on Thursday. A bright orange review sheet is going home on Monday to help students review at home.

Grade 4

Mrs. Noordam

Memory work: Trust the Lord 1 My son, don't forget my teaching, but let your heart keep my commands; 2 for they will bring you many days, a full life, and well-being. 3 Never let loyalty and faithfulness leave you. Tie them around your neck; write them on the tablet of your heart. 4 Then you will find favour and high regard with God and people. 5 Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not rely on your own understanding; 6 in all your ways know him, and he will make your paths straight. We will have a fill-in-the-blank test on verses 5 and 6 this Friday.

Bible: Students will work in groups on a crossword puzzle to review the story of Gideon. We will also read in Judges 9 about Abimelech.

Math: We continue with multiplication, reviewing the 4 and 5 times tables, and will begin practicing skip counting by 6. Last week, the students were introduced to long division! Ask your child how monkeys and bananas are a part of this process!

Spelling: In Lesson 8 we will focus on the suffix -y. The words and the rules they need to know are in their spelling lexicon. We will have a test this Friday.

Novel Study: In *Owls in the Family* we begin chapter 9. We also have a vocabulary test on chapters 7, 8, and 9 this Thursday. A vocabulary sheet to review has been sent home today. The vocabulary test for chapters 4-6 was returned today.

Social Studies: The interview with a farmer sheet is due on on Monday, November 17.

Science: Today we will join the grade eight class and dissect an owl pellet! This is a wonderful connection to our *Owls in the Family* novel study.

P.E: We have been working on our volleyball skills!

Grade Four French (Madame DeBoer): This week we start our workbooks together.

Grade 5

Mrs. Siertsema

I hope everyone is feeling refreshed and ready for a new week after a 4-day break! We (the teachers) had a good conference, and I very much appreciated attending professional development sessions on writing and math. There were many valuable takeaways that I will try to incorporate into my lessons in the coming weeks.

Here is what is upcoming in our curriculum for week 10!

Spelling: We are continuing with our spelling words from last week. The guiz will be on Friday.

Writing: Students will begin a small project to write a Remembrance Day poem, with the theme of Remembrance, using one of the poem types that they learned over the last two weeks.

Math: We will continue to practice using adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing to solve real-world problems. There will be a math test on Thursday this week. It will have a couple of questions for each operation type and real-world word problems.

Grammar: We will be finishing past tense verbs with a grammar quiz on Friday.

Literature: We have finished reading our novel "From Anna". Students will be given an assignment to write a persuasive essay to demonstrate their understanding of the novel. We will work through the steps of the assignment together in class.

Physical Education: We will continue to learn and practice various volleyball skills while participating in a variety of cooperative games.

Grade Five French (Madame DeBoer): We have started some "put the words in order" exercises; this helps establish grammar and syntax structures for second language learners. This week we look at "bizarre phrases" and try and make them make sense!

Mrs. Raja

Socials: We begin the unit by first meeting and understanding Indigenous Peoples in Canada before European contact. So we can discover who they were, where they lived, and how they interacted with one another.

Bible: We continue to memorize Exodus 19:5-6. We will recite it this Friday. "Now therefore, if you will indeed obey my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my treasured possession among all peoples, for all the earth is mine; and you shall be to me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.' These are the words that you shall speak to the people of Israel."

Art: 2 art periods have already been given to the class for brainstorming and creating their Remembrance Day poster. Any additional time required will need to be done at home. If your child is entering posters or a poem, please complete the admissions/permission sheets that are included in their backpack.

Grade 6

The following is what we have planned for this week:

Field Trip: We will be going away to the Pioneer Village this coming **Friday.** We plan to leave right away in the morning to get to London by 10am. Our visit lasts until 1pm so we should be back at the school for 3rd block; just in time for a memory work quiz and some art! Thank you to my parent volunteers for assisting on this trip. **I do still need one more helper. If you can tag along, please let me know.**

Grammar: We will start a new unit on Capitalization and Punctuation.

Novel Study: Final assessments on the book "Number the Stars" began last week. These assessments will be due on Monday November 10.

Memory: Colossians 1: 15-18 will be due on Friday.

Spelling: This week in spelling we will explore how rhyming words have 2 common spellings and sometimes we have to just see what looks right in order to spell words correctly.

Writing: We will be reviewing poetry terminology to complete our unit on poetry. We will also have some solid time working on our Remembrance Day poem.

Math: Students will be quizzed on 2 digit by 4-digit multiplication on **Tuesday**. Once this is completed, we will begin long division. Along side this, students will be completing their unit on angles and rotational symmetry. We will review this material and students will be tested on their angles next week **Tuesday**.

Bible: We will learn more deeply about how Jesus is our good Shepherd and will dive into the story of the Good Samaritan.

Art: Remembrance Day art will continue to be our focus. If your child desires to enter their art or poem into the Legion contest, they will need you to sign a permission form. These forms will be sent home this week.

Social Studies: This week students will be learning about worldview and doing some expository writing on the question: 'what difference does worldview make in the way I live my life?

Gym: Students are learning volleyball skills.

Music: Two more weeks of recorder then we will get into some music history.

Grade Six French (Madame DeBoer): We are starting our "put the words in order" exercises together! These types of activities help to solidify grammar structures and syntax in a different language.

Memory Work: 2 Samuel 7: 11b-16

Bible: We are continuing our examination of the Old Testament and the promise of a Saviour looking at the book of Judges, Samuel and the bridge from Samuel to the Kings that ultimately leads to the Messiah.

Math: This week we will be looking at Chapter 6 in the Nelson Textbook and examining integers adding and subtracting.

Literature: Continuing to look at our novel study "The Giver" chapters 6 through 10 and doing some journal writing responses to what we have been reading thus far.

Music: Finishing up our practice on 'Ode to Joy' using tone chimes and looking to begin our Christmas piece.

Physical Education: Becoming more proficient at team work, serving, making choices that best benefits the group while positioning for the best possible return in volleyball.

Science: We'll be wrapping up our first Science unit on *Understanding Life Systems and Interactions in the Environment* this week. Students will be dissecting owl pellets to explore energy transfer within a food web, and we'll write our end-of-unit test on **Wednesday, November 5**. Please note that the study sheet for this test was sent home last Tuesday, **October 28**.

Art and **Penmanship**: Students will continue practicing their cursive writing skills this week, and we'll also begin a new art project inspired by the work of Marc Chagall. In addition, students should finish their Remembrance Day posters at home, as the Legion will be picking them up on **November 14**. An entry form will be sent home this week that requires parental consent for your child's poster to be entered into the competition.

Our curriculum focuses this week:

Bible: This week, we will look at Jesus' words in Acts 1:8: "You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." We'll explore how this verse outlines the progression of the Book of Acts and the mission to spread the gospel to all nations. We will also study Paul and his missionary journeys, how God chose and prepared him to bring the good news to the Gentiles.

Memory verse: Acts 10: 34 – 35

Math: Students will learn how to express fractions as decimals, multiply and divide decimals, and explore ratios. Please note that there will be a math quiz on Friday covering everything we've worked on this week.

Literature: We're continuing our unit on Responding to Injustices, based on the short stories from our book Choices and Decisions.

Grammar: This week, we'll be focusing on verb tenses! We'll review past, present, and future tenses, and also explore the simple, continuous, perfect, and perfect continuous forms.

History: Finishing up the unit on Canada's Confederation doing review and preparing for a unit test on Thursday.

Geography: We will be finishing our unit on 'Patterns and Sustainability' by looking at the environmental effects on human settlements, sustainable settlements, and doing a sustainability audit of their hometown.

Physical Education: Becoming more proficient at team work, serving, making choices that best benefits the group while positioning for the best possible return in Volleyball.
