GRADE 1

GRADE 2

Memory work: Our memory work for the next two weeks is found in Ephesians 4:32,

"Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you." I will listen to this verse on Thursday, March 2.

Phonics: This week we will continue to look at words that have the long vowel 'e' in them. There are different ways to spell the long 'e' sound, including with a silent 'e', 'ee', 'ea', '-y' in a two syllable word and even 'e' by itself.

Spelling: Our spelling words are: **complete**, **funny**, **happy**, **feed**, **seem**, **street**, **team**, **reach**, **squeak** and **there**. Our spelling test will be on Friday, February 24.

Math: This week we will look at adding and subtracting coins and some word problems that go along with this. This is a great time to pull out some coins at home and practise counting them to get faster!

Writing: We are working our way through the novel *Charlotte's Web*. After each chapter we stop and respond to what we have read with some questions.

Science: What have we learned about moving in water by watching God's creation move? This week we will see how man has made things to help us move through the water faster.

Social Studies: We will look at the Canada Goose this week as we continue to study the symbols of Canada.

Music: Our Musical has been the focus of our music classes this month. We are working so hard to memorize the words to each song so that we are ready to be a part of the choir for our Musical Presentation in April.

GRADE 3

Wednesday: Library Day - don't forget to return your books tomorrow! Thursday: Game Day - for those who want to join, please bring a game to share.

Spelling: No spelling test this week!

Writing: We have a few more poetry forms to try our hand at writing! I hope you have enjoyed the various writing pieces that have gone home.

Reading: We will likely finish reading *Stone Fox* this week. Little Willy has entered a dog sled race to try and win the \$500 they owe in taxes. Will he win?

Math: We have been working on mental math in addition and subtraction. Part of this unit is rounding to the nearest 10 and the nearest 100.

French: We will finish up Unité H this week and will have a short quiz next week.

Music: We have a few orchestra instrument activities to wrap up in the next couple of weeks, but the bulk of our music classes will be learning songs for our spring musical.

Memory Work - Over the next several weeks we will focus on memorizing the songs for our upcoming performance, *Acorn to Oaks*. This week we will focus on the song, 'Fruit that is Rooted in You'. There will be no formal test and we will review and sing this in class!

Bible - This week we will discuss the story of Moses and Jethro. Highlights of this story are :

1. Jethro suggested that Moses appoint judges to assist him.

2. Moses and the people were both frustrated and tired before more judges were appointed.

3. The people needed one set of laws to follow.

Social Studies - Students have been studying the map of Canada - learning about provinces and territories as well as capital cities. Each child was assigned a province or a territory to research at school. Students will be working on a research project in a pamphlet/brochure form. Students have access to books, however, if your child would like to do some research at home and bring it to school they are welcome to do so!

GRADE 4/5

<u>Grade 4/5</u>

Bible: This week, we will continue to unpack the meaning of Jesus' teachings in The Sermon on the Mount. Our memory verse this week is as follows:

May the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable to you, Lord, my rock and my Redeemer. (Psalm 19:14, CSB)

Students will be tested on their memory verse on Friday, February 24, 2023.

Social Studies: This week, the class will be introduced to their next topic, *Ancient Farming*. In this unit, we will learn about the farming practices in ancient Egypt and ancient China before comparing these practices with modern Canadian farming practices.

Writing: We will conclude our study of Langston Hughes and his poetry this week. Toward the end of the week, the class will begin learning the structure of cinquain poems and will try writing their own.

Spelling and Grammar: Spelling will be sent home with students on **Tuesday, February 21, 2023**. This week's focus is on the prefixes, -over and its meanings. We will complete a formal lesson on the words this Monday and will complete a carousel of spelling activities during the week. Students, as always, are encouraged to study their words each night in order to be prepared for their test on **Friday, February 24, 2023**.

<u>Grade 4</u>

Math: Grade 4 students will use their knowledge of the 3, 4, 6, 7, 8 and 9x tables to solve simple division problems.

Literature: Students will continue to read chapters and complete comprehension questions from our current novel, *Owls in the Family* by Farley Mowatt.

<u>Grade 5</u>

(Miss Hotke) Math: Grade 5 has started their new Chapter on Operations with Decimals. I will continue to give homework each night for the students to review the work done in class.

(Mrs. Noordam) Literature: In our novel, *Maniac Magee*, we are starting chapter 27 this week. These are very short chapters and we are almost finished part two of the book! A quiz will be coming up on chapters 27-31. This quiz will be on vocab words as well as comprehension of the chapters. Students are always encouraged to take their work home to study the vocab words.

(Mrs. Lisson) Grade4/5 French: Only two more weeks until we present the play "Trois Petits Cochons." Students should have their lines. In class we have made masks for the presentation and if students want to add to their character by dressing up they are free to put an costume together. Grade 4/5 will present on March 1.

GRADE 5/6

Upcoming: A Bible test is scheduled for this Thursday. Review sheets have been sent home. A math test will also be in the near future for both classes. I have not figured out an exact day yet, but they do have their review sheets already.

Memory Work: This week we will be focusing on Romans 11:33. Due to electives this month, and other circumstances, the quiz over the verse will be this **Thursday**. We will continue saying and writing out the verse during our Bible time.

Spelling: This week our spelling words will all begin with the prefixes "ir-" "il-" "im" and "in". Students should have a list of their spelling words and should be working on their words at home. Like the memory work, the spelling quiz will be this **Thursday**.

Math: Grade 6 has started into their new Chapter on Percents and is quickly working through it. Grade 5 has started their new Chapter on Operations with Decimals. I will continue to give homework each night for the students to review the work done in class. Please help your child to do their homework as it is an important part of their grade.

Homework Folders: I will continue to encourage the students to bring their homework folders home each night, but I hope you will check to see that they have their homework complete and placed back in their folder before they come to school. We are still missing out on a lot of schoolwork because they are not handing in their homework.

Phys Ed: The junior basketball tournament was last week Thursday, and was a great success! The students won all of the games they played. This week we will be learning a new sport, Floorball. My older sister, Sonja, is on the Canadian Women's Floorball team and is playing against the USA this weekend. Both countries are vying for a spot in the World Championships in Denmark.

Silent Reading: Students have been told they need to have a book in their desk for silent reading. These can be their own books from home or books they have borrowed from the library.

It will be on the three types of Psalms we studied in class as well as a page of poetry terms (for example- imagery, simile, personification, repetition, etc.) Students have the terms in their duotangs; we have discussed this in class and they have been encouraged to review at home. This week we also plan to study poetry by Robert Frost.

(Mrs. Lisson) Grade 7 French: We are wrapping up the unit on Destination D'hiver. Students will demonstrate what they have learned about winter destinations, activities, and adjectives by creating a postcard. This will be the final assessment for the unit.

(Mrs. Lisson) Grade 8 French: Students will have a test on Bizarre et Fascinant on February 28. Students should be able to describe the animals from the unit. We are also learning how to write sentences using the superlative and comparative, and this will be on the test too.
