Why "wh"?

Memory Work: We will continue to review Psalm 23 in its entirety as well as begin to learn the school graduation song, "The Blessing".

Bible: The Good Samaritan - Luke 10:25-37 Mary and Martha - Luke 10:38-42

Show and Tell: The final digraph for this year is "wh". Students can bring a show and tell item with this digraph or an item of their own choosing. They can also bring in something related to our new unit of study, "Plants".

Handwriting: We are nearing the end of our handwriting books! The remainder of the year for JK will consist of some review of uppercase letter, an introduction to lowercase letter as well as completing the last of our number and colour work. SK students will continue to work on sentence writing with a focus on letter formation and spacing.

SK Phonics: During the final few weeks of school, students will be reviewing their phonemic awareness skills. They will also be assessed on their ability to identify phonemes, rhyme, count syllables and manipulate words.

Theme of the Week: A short new unit on the topic of plants and gardening is beginning this week. We will start by discussing different types of plants and exploring the area around of our school to see which varieties grow here. We will also discuss what a living thing is, the parts of a plant and what is necessary for a plant to grow. Everyone will be planting a royal burgundy bush bean which has been provided by Lambton County Library. This is in conjunction with the "One Seed Lambton" project. More information on this project as well as an additional package of seeds will be sent home with each KinderStart student. Please take time to read the informational brochure to learn where fresh produce can be donated in Lambton County.

GRADE 1

"Phonics: We will wrap up long 'A' and begin long 'I' this week!

Spelling: made, shape, take, game, brave, time, ride, size, five

Math: We are adding and subtracting numbers to 50!

Track and Field: Wow! Students in grade 1 did so well last week at Track and Field Day! Parents, you may be hearing or reading about District field day. Students are eligible to move on to the district level once they're in grade 2. On Wednesday I will be away with the track team, so a substitute teacher will be filling in in grade 1 for the day.

Plants: We have learned so much about plants in grade 1. This week we'll wrap things up by studying flowers and fruit. On Thursday, June 9 we will have a test on our plant unit.

French: This week we'll finish up our unit on the rooms of a house. I will be assessing students orally on the French vocabulary we've been working on.

Field Trip: On June 14 we will be going to the Lambton Centre for archery, a low-ropes course and a hike! Would you like to join us for this year-end trip? I'm looking for 2-3 more parents to chaperone the grade 1 class.

Graduation: It's been 3 years since we've had a normal JKCS graduation! That means this class wasn't even in school yet! Please mark your calendars for the evening of June 22; we will be celebrating our grade 8s together as a school community. Students in all grades will be part of a choir performance of "The Blessing" that evening!

GRADE 2

Memory Work: Our memory work for this week is found in Romans 8: 31, 32.

"If God is for us, who is against us? He did not even spare His own Son but gave Him up for us all. How will He not also, with Him grant us everything?"

I will listen to memory work on Friday, June 3.

Phonics: Our focus this week is on the suffixes -er and -est. We will learn that -er can be used to show someone who does something (teacher, baker) or can be used to compare (bigger, lighter).

Spelling: Our spelling words for this week are: teacher, baker, bigger, lighter, cleanest, slowest, oldest, strongest, bravest and tallest. Our spelling test will be on Friday, June 3.

Math: This week we will begin to look at Graphing. We will begin by seeing how we can take some information that has been collected and organise it in a way that it can be shown in a graph. We will focus on pictographs and bar graphs this week.

Writing: We will finish up our fiction stories this week and soon they will be coming home! For Art this week we will be creating one clay picture much like the pictures in Barbara Reid's books, to go with our story.

Science: We had a wonderful time of learning last Friday as some volunteers from the Pinery Provincial Park came to visit us and show us some examples of the different animal groups. Our focus this week will be on Birds as we investigate the characteristics that make all birds unique to this group. Wednesday we will have a scavenger hunt in our classroom as we find and discover facts about birds.

Social Studies: We will focus on the special celebrations that are unique to Australia this week. We are getting ready for a "class trip" to Australia before the end of the school year!

Track and Field: Some of our class will be away at the district track and field meet this Wednesday as they go and represent our school. We pray that this will be a wonderful day of competition. I will be going with our team to the district meet so the grade twos will join with the grade threes for a day of learning.

GRADE 3

We had two special guests last week! We are grateful that Mrs. Boeringa from the Lambton library and two naturalists from the Pinery could add some hands-on learning to our week. Along with field day, it was a wonderful week. Can you believe we have only four more weeks of school?

Spelling: We are on Lesson 29 this week and our focus is on homonyms -- words that sounds the same but have different spellings and meanings like night and knight, and our and hour. Test on Friday!

Parts of Speech: Prepositions is our focus this week! Only two parts of speech left to learn.

Reading: Our last reading unit of the year will focus on Forces Causing Motion. As we read we will understand how asking questions help us to understand what we are reading which will lead to better comprehension.

Math: This week we will finish up our graphing unit. Our focus will be on: I can create a graph with given information, I can interpret graphs by answering questions, and I can figure out the mode and mean on a graph.

French: Our last French unit is one of review. We will stretch our minds all the way back to the beginning of the year and see how much vocabulary we still remember and if we can use it to answer questions we learned throughout the year.

Memory Work: Psalm 8:5 - 6

Please work on verse 5-6 and the test will be this Friday (on all 6 verses!).

Bible - On Friday we will be having a final test on our unit entitled, 'Forty Years in the Wilderness'. We will review this week and a review sheet was sent home on Friday.

Science - We will look at how birds have different types of beaks and how we can tell what they eat by just looking at the shape of their beak!

Student projects are mostly completed and throughout the coming days students will have an opportunity to present to their classmates what they learned about the bird they studied.

GRADE 4/5

Bible: This week, grade 4/5 will turn their focus to the freedom we are given in Christ as His followers. The class will look at Paul's messages to the Colossiansof how they are to keep their focus on Jesus amidst the distractions of the world.

We will be moving on to a new memory verse this week:

"So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God." (Colossians 3: 1, CSB).

Literacy

Reading: In our reading lessons, we will focus on, 'reading like a writer.' In other words, we will read a few examples of texts in our Nelson literacy books, where the author has carefully chosen words or phrases to inform their audience and to give their writing a strong voice.

Writing: Students will conclude writing their biographies this week and will continue to edit their work as they complete each body paragraph. The goal of this week is for students to write about the achievements of their chosen person in spite of their disabilities.

Spelling and Grammar: Students will receive their spelling lists on **Monday**, **May 30th** and will be given time on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday in class to practice their words. Further to this, students will need to spend time practicing words at home in order to be well-prepared for their formal test on **Friday**, **June 3rd**. In our grammar lessons we will practice identifying sentence fragments and run-on sentences so that we can find and correct them in our written work.

Science: The class will begin the week by reviewing observations made in their latest science experiment on energy transformation. In the latter part of the week, we will begin reviewing the concepts we have learned in our science unit this term. This would include renewable and non-renewable sources of energy, laws of the conservation of energy and energy transformation. Students will be tested on the concepts we have covered on *Friday*, *June 3rd*.

Math: At the end of last week, grade 4 students began their next unit on Fractions. At the beginning of the week, students will continue to review what they remember of fractions, how to write them and the different parts of a fraction. As the week progresses, students will learn how to compare fractions and how to determine which fractions are equivalent to each other. Although we have completed multiplication and division for this year, students are strongly encouraged to continue to practice their times tables in order to improve their confidence with them.

Art: Students in grades 4, 5 and 6 will complete their Andy Goldsworthy land art pieces this week and will also complete a written reflection where they evaluate their use of Goldworthy's techniques and how they included different elements of art in their work.

GRADE 5/6

Bible: In Bible, we are exploring the Last Battle and the imagery that John uses in Revelation 13. We'll then head over to learn about the New Heaven and Earth as described in Revelation 21 and 22.

Our memory verse for this week comes from Revelation 4: 9-10 (ESV):

And they sang a new song, saying, "Worthy are you to take the scroll and to open its seals,

Math: In Grade 5, we are starting our next unit on Ratios where we'll learn the terminology and use it to describe ratios of quantities and how to find equivalent ratios as well. Their work with equivalent fractions will assist in this manner.

Science: This week, Grade 5/6 we will be exploring a case study into the impact of solar farms and pipe lines and how they can help and impact others. To finish off our unit, a Science Test is being scheduled for Friday, June 3rd with a review sheet being handed out on the Monday to help students prepare for it.

Writing/Reading: In Writing, students will be using their articles to begin writing their report on their renewable source. This week we'll be working on finishing our rough copy and heading into the editing stages that will help us with our good copies the week after.

In Reading, we'll be reading and completing different skills lessons about our novel study has the following week will have us completing the book and starting our culminating activity to wrap up the unit. P.S.: Spelling test this Friday. Be sure to practice writing your spellings each night to prepare for the test.

Music: We will be focusing on completing our belts, as well as, learning a new singing song for the Grade 8 graduation.

Gym: This week, due to district, we'll be playing some team based games to work on sportsmanship and working as a team.
